WORLD VISION'S GLOBAL IMPACT

In a year defined by the uptick in the cost of living and the rising tide of global conflict, World Vision's work empowered vulnerable children, families and communities to build resilience and rise above poverty. **Here's a quick look at our global impact in 2023:**



3 million children were part of **child sponsorship** in 1,088 area programmes around the world



Over 2.1 million advocacy actions taken by World Vision supporters who campaigned for vulnerable children in 40 countries



15.2 million children in **54 countries** benefitted from child sponsorship programmes



229,513 children under five were

treated for wasting (or severe malnutrition) in 13 countries, and more than 83% recovered



We contributed to **752 policy changes** that address the root causes of vulnerability for children



3.1 million people gained access to clean water, including **1,534 schools serving 591,000 children,** and **514 healthcare facilities**





We strengthened education systems by reaching over **11,660 education officials** and community volunteers, **194,810 parents**, and distributed **383,448 education resources**



We reached **11.5 million people** with food assistance programming and another **9.8 million people** with cash and voucher programming across a total of **54 countries**



More than **158,000** predominantly smallholder farmers have been trained in improved and sustainable agricultural and Natural Resource Management techniques




Over **1,375 child protection projects** were implemented in 40 countries, including over **1.1 million children** who participated in actions to **end violence against children**



Humanitarian assistance reached 36.4 million people (including 18.8 million children) in response to 76 natural and man-made disasters across 60 countries



World Vision provided assistance to **1 out of every 4 people** reached by humanitarian aid globally



Answer: Child Sponsorship is World Vision's flagship programme for long-term, sustainable transformation.

Our unique approach tackles the root causes of poverty and empowers children, families and communities to build a brighter future for themselves. When you sponsor a child, your contribution doesn't go directly to your child but rather into a pool of funds that brings sustainable, transformational change to your child's community. This includes:

- improving children's education opportunities
- strengthening child protection
- helping families diversify and grow their livelihoods
- improving access to clean water, nutritious food and reliable healthcare
- building community resilience to disasters

That's why, for every child sponsored, at least four other children benefit too.

Sponsors are encouraged to send letters, cards and gifts to their sponsored child. There's nothing more rewarding than watching a child grow and thrive through your support!

GLOBAL CHILD SPONSORSHIP FACTS

- Over the last 12 years, **88%** of the severely malnourished children we treated made a full recovery
- Over the last three years, child sponsors helped equip more than **200,000 farmers** with seeds, livestock and tools to improve production, increase income, and provide for their children
- In 2023, 34,000 children took part in **Chosen**, a sponsorship invitation that enables children to choose their own sponsor. Read a **Chosen** testimony on page 20

THE IMPACT YOU MADE IN 2023



Health & Nutrition

- 11,199 children had their growth monitored consistently
- 9,840 children grew their awareness of health issues
- **10,437 pregnant mothers and mothers with children under 2** gained knowledge of maternal health and good nutrition



Water, Sanitation & Hygiene

- **8,435 people** have access to proper handwashing stations in their communities
- 3,326 people have access to latrines
- 5,737 people have clean water in their communities



Education

- **17,092 children** received educational support such as stationeries, schoolbags and books
- 9,235 children are learning literacy and numeracy skills
- **13,544 youths and children** gained helpful life skills in areas like self-protection, child abuse knowledge and digital safety





Livelihoods

- 4,536 individuals (including children) were trained in disaster risk reduction so their livelihoods would be more resilient to emergencies
- 4,090 people learned how to grow their incomes (e.g. raising animals, setting up small businesses and planting home gardens)
- 14,180 savings group members participated actively

Child Protection

- 14,086 children participated in children's clubs
- **34,291 community members** know what to do when a child protection issue is raised
- 33,306 parents learned how to better protect their children



Highlight: Rajika Makes an Impact!

Before joining the Children's Club in her community, 14-year-old Rajika from Sri Lanka had a fear of presenting in front of others. By taking part in various activities, her talents came to the forefront and she began to understand herself in a positive way. Said Rajika:

"I had the opportunity to participate in World Vision's **End Violence against Children campaign**. I performed in a drama on the negative effects of parents' alcohol and drug use on children... I have become a happy, confident and strong girl, and I believe that I can face the future without fear!"

HELPING GIRLS LIVE FREE OF FEAR!

No girl should have to live in fear, but they often find themselves in danger everywhere. Poverty pushes it to another level. In many impoverished and marginalised communities, many girls are forced to drop out of school to work, while others must marry and bear children before they are ready.

At World Vision, we think that enough is enough. And through the **1,000 Girls campaign**, we sought to put an end to this state of affairs! Our objective: **find child sponsors for 1,000 girls by the International Day of the Girl on 11 October 2023.**

During the campaign launch at The Gardens Hotel (which generously sponsored the venue) on 15 July, we were privileged to have Di from Vietnam join us. With the support of World Vision and her Malaysian sponsor Ms. Heng, she was empowered to stand tall.



Di lives in Tua Chua, one of the poorest districts in Vietnam. Early marriage is common there, with many girls attending school till they are 10 then dropping out to help their family with farm work while waiting to be married off. Most of Di's female relatives were married at 14 or 15, and became mothers soon after.

When Di was in Grade 8 (14 years old), she was also forced to drop out of school. **As soon as World Vision staff learned about her situation, they stepped in.** Alongside local partners, they visited Di's family multiple times to persuade them to let Di return to school. Eventually, they agreed. World Vision also supported Di and her family with economic assistance and school supplies.



Today, Di is the first person from her village to enter university, pursuing her dream of becoming a pre-school teacher at the Hanoi National University of Education. For both Di and her sponsor Ms. Heng, this was a special moment:

"I am grateful to World Vision and my sponsor. Without them, I would not have all the opportunities I've had. I hope more girls will be given the same opportunities so they can live a life full of possibilities," - Di.

"Thank you for giving me this opportunity to be beside you in your journey. I didn't know that the little things I did would actually [make] such a big impact. I hope that you'll be successful and in return give others this same opportunity." - Ms. Heng

ADVOCACY – SPEAKING UP FOR CHILDREN!

#RunForChildren 2023



On 7 May 2023, runners from across Malaysia gathered at Dataran DBKL for the **2023 World Vision Malaysia #RunForChildren!** After two years of virtual runs, it was thrilling to see so many in person running 42 minutes for the 42 rights of children.

More than 2,500 participants raised over **RM190,000** for our global child protection efforts. Among them was 32-year-old Mahomed from Leicester, UK, who came with his wife Zeenat, 31, and their two children. Mahomed, who is severely visually impaired, ran accompanied by a volunteer guide. Said Mahomed: "We're lucky to have things like free healthcare and education. Life is much easier for my children than for children in other parts of the world. It's great that we can support them and make a difference."

30-Hour Famine 2023

The annual 30-Hour Famine is a global movement that empowers Malaysia's youths to stand against hunger and poverty by learning about global issues, fasting and raising funds.

30-Hour Famine Ambassador 2023 **Victor Wong** led our Famine Fighters to Strike Out Hunger! The well-loved singer-songwriter visited our Tulid Community Development Programme in Sabah, where he got a first-hand look at our work. He even taught children oral hygiene through song! Deeply touched, Victor said:

"The community here faces many challenges, and I want to express my gratitude to the local leaders and volunteers for their time and sacrifices in helping the community." In total, close to **8,000 participants raised RM726,972,** turning hunger into hope for vulnerable children and communities. The Countdown event was held at the Cheras North International Convention Centre, where Victor and our supporting celebrities celebrated our Famine Fighters' achievements with entertaining performances!

EMERGENCY RELIEF – SYRIA-TÜRKIYE EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE





On 6 February 2023, two devastating earthquakes and numerous aftershocks hit Southeastern Türkiye and Northwest Syria, killing over 55,000, injuring nearly 130,000 and leaving millions homeless.

World Vision, backed by the generous contributions of our donors and supporters, facilitated the implementation of many diverse relief and rehabilitation projects in the affected areas. This included:

- Child Protection
- Mental Health and Psychosocial Services
- Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)
- Livelihoods
- Health & Nutrition
- Education

Thanks to our donors, over RM860,000 in donations was raised for the Syria-Türkiye Earthquake Response. Here are some of the projects your generous contributions helped support (as of 31 August 2023):



547,006 people were provided with clean and safe water through water trucking and/or new water points.



21,857 families received multi-purpose cash assistance to cover their basic needs, such as food, shelter, and WASH items.



11,463 beneficiaries were provided with ready-to-eat meals in areas where food was neither available nor affordable.



144,769 people were reached by health consultations.



36,517 children were reached by supporting affected schools with learning materials.



32,603 children received psychosocial support kits.



17,344 girls and boys benefitted from fuel and heaters provided to schools.



22,466 people gained access to rehabilitated health centres.

Earthquakes won't stop Sahar from learning!

Nine-year-old Sahar, who has endured war and displacement, was further traumatised when the earthquake destroyed her home and school in Northwest Syria. "I am afraid to go to school. I don't want the building to fall down when I start studying," Sahar said. With World Vision's support, she resumed her education, and is on the path towards new dreams.

"I have five friends. We play together, they're like my sisters. I love my teacher who helped me to go back to school," says Sahar. "I want to finish my education and be a doctor!"



HELPING AT HOME -OUR WORK IN MALAYSIA

2023 was a time for us to spread our wings in Malaysia, with significant progress being made in our work among local vulnerable communities. Here's our highlight reel from a memorable year:



One Goal Malaysia

In 2023, One Goal Malaysia's Eat Right to Play Right Programme made further inroads into urban poor communities, inspiring children across the Klang Valley to eat well and live well through the power of badminton:

- We launched 2 new programme areas in PPR (Program Perumahan Rakyat) Kota Damansara and PPR Kg Baru Hicom
- **156 children participated in our badminton training programme.** In between training sessions, the children learned about nutrition, eating balanced meals and living healthily
- **PPR Lembah Subang 2** completed its programme, and the participants graduated with the knowledge they need to live healthier lives
- 61 mothers participated in **Community Kitchen** workshops, where they learned new recipes, and how to prepare balanced, economical meals for their families
- Volunteer Coach Training sessions were conducted, empowering **35 volunteer coaches** to teach children about badminton and good nutrition

Uplifting Communities in Sabah

Through your generous contributions, our Community Development Programmes (CDPs) in Sabah (Mukim Tulid and Mukim Tatalaan) achieved the following:





Community Empowerment

- We successfully handed over a **local pre-school in Tulid CDP** to the pre-school committee, supported by two early childhood educators
- **118 Starter Group members** were trained and are serving on local committees such as Child Protection Committees, Health Committees and Farmers' Groups
- There are now nine Children's Clubs, with 330 children participating
- **55 of the most vulnerable families (***Keluarga Prihatin***)** were supported through home visits
- 90 Starter Group members and community leaders participated in annual planning and reflection sessions



Health & Nutrition

- **82 mothers** benefited from the home garden initiative and were able to provide supplementary nutrition to their children
- 44 mothers and fathers participated in Mothers' Cooking Group activities
- In Tatalaan CDP, **37 mothers** attended nutrition workshops and participated in cooking competitions
- 346 households benefited from a continuous clean water supply
- In Tulid CDP, health awareness sessions were conducted with support from local partners. **69 adults and 51 children** benefited

Christine's Eye-Opening Journey in Tua Chua, Vietnam

When it comes to understanding how you're changing a child's life, seeing is believing. In December 2022, 12 child sponsors visited the Tua Chua, Vietnam Area Programme to see what their contributions had done for their sponsored children and their communities!



Those who went on the visit left as firm believers in the power of child sponsorship. Among them was Christine, who met her sponsored child A Co.

Despite the language barrier, she was able to strike up a rapport with A Co, no doubt helped by the letters he had written to her. Christine was gratified that A Co could learn and grow up healthy through her contributions. She reflected:

"I think the most rewarding [part of child sponsorship] is seeing the child grow... and progress in life. This is the first, and... probably the last time I'm going to meet him and I think I will remember this experience for the rest of my life."

The value of a choice

Children don't often get to make decisions for themselves. That's why we introduced **Chosen** – a child sponsorship initiative that lets children choose their own child sponsors. This simple act reaffirms their dignity and changes their futures.



On **14 May 2023**, members of Tabernacle of David Church learned which child from Lanao Del Norte, Philippines had chosen them. Among the sponsors-to-be was **Pastor Irene Chong**. We sat down to ask what being chosen means to her.

Pastor Irene was struck by the fact that her sponsored child was named Jhon. "When I had my first child, I thought that, if it was a boy, he would be named Jonathan." She is glad that she can bless those in need, one child at a time.

"Jhon, I hope that you will grow to know that you are valuable and precious... you are significant and you have a good future. Be happy, keep yourself well, and God bless you."

ACCOUNTABILITY AND GOVERNANCE

World Vision Malaysia is committed to ensuring the proper and responsible use of contributions received. All projects are appraised, managed and monitored by World Vision Malaysia according to strict cost control policies and audits that govern us as an international humanitarian organisation.

For the Financial Year 2023:

- 83% (RM37,692,489) was used to support community development projects, emergency relief and work by local charities
- **18% (RM8,239,226)** of contributions received were spent on Fundraising, Donor Care and Administration

Due to a fundraising shortfall, we used RM431,711 of reserve funds to fulfil our commitments in 2023. As a result, an additional 1% was added to our total expenditures, which is reflected in the percentages above.

World Vision Malaysia's Audit Committee, comprising Board Members Datuk Ho Hon Sang, Emeritus Prof. Dr. P. T. Thomas and Esther Ong, monitored the use of funds, reviewed financial statements and managed the appointment of our external auditor. In 2023, PKF PLT was appointed to perform our annual financial audit.
